SUNDAYS AT ST RICHARD'S – LATEST NEWS

What a joy to gather together on Sunday 25 July, to sing inside and to share a bring-your-own picnic lunch in the outside space. Many more of those to come we hope! That was also our last planned Zoom broadcast for the moment (but sermon audio recordings are still posted weekly to the church website). If you are a regular member of the church family, you will know that our plan is to come out of lockdown and social distancing gradually. We long to open up and do as much as we can together, but the overriding principle is a love and concern for others, especially those who feel less confident and more vulnerable than we might. So that said, a brief reminder of some of the things we are doing, and encouraging all of us to do together, over the coming weeks:

- We will still have hand sanitiser at the doors for you to use coming in and going out.
- Masks are not compulsory but we expect that a good number will still choose to wear them when entering and leaving. We are encouraging everyone to use a mask whilst singing.
- We will keep the building ventilated through the summer months with windows open.
- We plan an extra row of chairs to be put in the main worship area as needed, anytime from Sun 15 Aug.
- We are allowed to sit next to each other on rows, but as a courtesy please ask the person you plan to sit next to if they want you to leave a seat empty or not, and please, if you feel more comfortable with a seat between you and another household do say so to the person planning to sit next to you without any embarrassment. Consider this too, when sitting in front of, or behind, someone on the rows.
- We can chat in the building after a service, but if the weather is fine, we encourage you to chat outside.
- We continue to encourage people to exit via the back door into the outside space for the time being.
- We will continue to have just bread at The Lord's Supper during the summer and hope to reintroduce wine in September. This is also when we will look at serving refreshments after services again.
- 'Summer services together' are all ages together (no separate children's groups), but they are not All Age services. Instead, there will be a shorter sermon plus activity sheets for children and young people.
- We plan for children and young people's groups to restart on Sunday 5 September.

Do continue to join together in giving thanks and praise to God for getting us to this point! Ben

OTHER NEWS ...

Road closure – Walshes Road! South East Water plan to install 200m of new water main in Walshes Road, from July 26. The project is expected to take c.12 weeks to complete. Walshes Road will be closed for the duration in three sections: First, between Stone Cross Road and Walshes Road to the junction at Kingfisher Drive. Secondly, between Kingfisher Drive and Nightingales. Finally, between Nightingales and Luxford Road. This will impact traffic from the south, but the church is still accessible from the Whitehill Road end of Fermor Road. For more details see: https://corporate.southeastwater.co.uk/walshesroad
