ST RICHARD'S – LATEST NEWS

Unity and stability as a church family are two key things to maintain during the vacancy – **Ephesians 4:1-16.** Steve Rees has been working to put an interim leadership in place at St Richard's until the new Minister comes, whilst I have sought to ensure St Richard's Management Team (SRMT) are as strong and representative as possible to provide support. Both the interim leadership and SRMT will work together, alongside the church Administrator. Steve and I hope this 'triangle' of relationships (Interim Pastoral Leadership, SRMT and Administrator) is a good structure to help provide unity and stability in the coming months. So in addition to praying for **the whole church family**, for **all who serve** in the life of the church, for **those involved leading teams/groups**, and for **Tony Hoyle looking after our building as Facilities Manager;** please pray especially for:

(David & Elizabeth Buck will join the church family for a season from All Saints. David Buck will be Interim Pastoral Leader, working alongside David Phillips as Interim Assistant Pastoral Leader).

A final update on the VACANCY and discussions about the next Minister. After a lengthy PCC discussion, it was agreed to allow the current advert for a Licensed Lay Minister to continue (closing date 15 Oct). Should an appointment of a suitable candidate not be made, the matter will return to the PCC to consider the possibility of advertising for an Ordained Minister for St Richard's as a 'like for like' replacement for me. This will have significant financial implications for both churches. In light of all this – and for St Richard's in seeking to secure the Outreach & Pastoral Worker post beyond three years (Trish is currently entering the third year) – both churches are planning to have Gift Days over the next few weeks. For St Richard's this will be, aptly, Sunday 3 October – Harvest Sunday. More information and Gift Day leaflet will be given as soon as possible, but do please be praying on about staffing and finances now.

SUNDAYS AT ST RICHARD'S

We hit the autumn term with the same freedoms to worship that we have enjoyed through the summer. Praise the Lord for that! If you are a regular member of the church family, you will know that our plan is to continue coming out of lockdown and social distancing gradually. We long to open up and do as much as we can together, but the overriding principle is a love and concern for others, especially those who feel less confident and more vulnerable than we might. So that said, a brief reminder of some of the things we are doing, and encouraging all of us to do together, over the coming weeks:

- We will still have **hand sanitiser** at the doors for you to use coming in and going out.
- **Masks** are not compulsory but please do wear a face covering if you would like (though we are asking everyone to wear one when we sing together).
- We will keep the building **ventilated** as much as possible, with windows open.
- Rows of **seating** remain spaced out a little more than usual but due to increasing numbers, we plan to review adding the extra row of seats ahead of Sunday 3 October. (As a courtesy please ask the person you plan to sit next to if they want you to leave a seat empty or not, and please, if you feel more comfortable with a seat between you and another household do say so to the person planning to sit next to you without any embarrassment. Consider this too, when sitting in front of, or behind, someone on the rows.)
- We can **chat** in the building after a service, but if the weather is fine, we encourage you to chat outside.
- We continue to encourage people to **exit** via the back door into the outside space for the time being.
- We plan to trial reintroducing wine to **The Lord's Supper** this month in a safe manner.
- We have made the decision to postpone serving **refreshments** on Sundays for a while longer as we consider how it works practically, especially as we try to gain normality of seating in the worship area.

- Road closure Walshes Road! South East Water plan to install 200m of new water main in Walshes Road, from July 26. The project is expected to take c.12 weeks to complete. Walshes Road will be closed for the duration in three sections: First, between Stone Cross Road and Walshes Road to the junction at Kingfisher Drive. Secondly, between Kingfisher Drive and Nightingales. Finally, between Nightingales and Luxford Road.
