ST RICHARD'S - LATEST NEWS

A final update on the VACANCY and discussions about the next Minister. After a lengthy PCC discussion, it was agreed to allow the current advert for a Licensed Lay Minister to continue (closing date 15 Oct). Should an appointment of a suitable candidate not be made, the matter will return to the PCC to consider the possibility of advertising for an Ordained Minister for St Richard's as a replacement for me. This will have significant financial implications for both churches. In light of all this – and for St Richard's in seeking to secure the Outreach & Pastoral Worker post beyond three years (Trish is currently entering the third year) – both churches are hosting Gift Days. St Richard's Gift Day is this Sunday, 3 October – Harvest Sunday. The Gift Day leaflet was sent out last week and is also included in this week's newsletter mailing too. Do bring pledge forms to church this Sunday and please be praying on about staffing and finances.

SUNDAYS AT ST RICHARD'S

We hit the autumn term with the same freedoms to worship that we have enjoyed through the summer. Praise the Lord for that! If you are a regular member of the church family, you will know that our plan is to continue coming out of lockdown and social distancing gradually. We long to open up and do as much as we can together, but the overriding principle is a love and concern for others, especially those who feel less confident and more vulnerable than we might. So that said, a brief reminder of some of the things we are doing, and encouraging all of us to do together, over the coming weeks:

- We will still have hand sanitiser at the doors for you to use coming in and going out.
- **Masks** are not compulsory but please do wear a face covering if you would like (though we are asking everyone to wear one when we sing together).
- We will keep the building **ventilated** as much as possible, with windows open.
- Rows of seating remain spaced out a little more than usual but due to increasing numbers, we plan to
 review adding the extra row of seats ahead of Sunday 17 October. (For courtesy please ask the person you
 plan to sit next to if they want you to leave a seat empty or not, and please, if you feel more comfortable
 with a seat between you and another household do say so to the person planning to sit next to you without
 any embarrassment. Consider this too, when sitting in front of, or behind, someone on the rows.)
- We can chat in the building after a service, but if the weather is fine, we encourage you to chat outside.
- We continue to encourage people to **exit** via the back door into the outside space for the time being.
- We plan to continue our trial of reintroducing wine to The Lord's Supper this term in a safe manner.
- We have made the decision to postpone serving **refreshments** on Sundays for a while longer **hoping to re-start on Sunday 17 October** as we consider how it works practically, especially as we try to gain normality of seating in the worship area.

A joint partnership project with Forest Fold Baptist church. Give thanks for the 21 children who came in September, including a number of families from Alderbrook, and new faces. Pray on that God might use these times to bring people into His Kingdom, and do consider joining the team to help serve at this event contact Trish at the church office for more details.
- Men's event Encouraging for Friendship and Evangelism Tues 5 Oct, 7-9.30pm. 
