# **ST RICHARD'S – LATEST NEWS**

We continue to pray on for applications, interviews and appointment of the next Minister for St Richard's. We are also so grateful to God for the response to last Sunday's Gift Day. In helping support our church family finances, initial figures look like we have pledged together a monthly increase of around £775 towards the £750 we were aiming for! On top of which one-off gifts have totalled just over £6,200 so far. This puts the church family in a great position for 2022 budget and decisions to be made on staffing and the new Minister.

# SUNDAYS AT ST RICHARD'S

We hit the autumn term with the same freedoms to worship that we have enjoyed through the summer. Praise the Lord for that! If you are a regular member of the church family, you will know that our plan is to continue coming out of lockdown and social distancing gradually. We long to open up and do as much as we can together, but the overriding principle is a love and concern for others, especially those who feel less confident and more vulnerable than we might. So that said, a brief reminder of some of the things we are doing, and encouraging all of us to do together, over the coming weeks:

- We will still have **hand sanitiser** at the doors for you to use coming in and going out.
- **Masks** are not compulsory but please do wear a face covering if you would like (though we are asking everyone to wear one when we sing together).
- Rows of **seating** remain spaced out a little more than usual but as a courtesy please ask the person you plan to sit next to if they want you to leave a seat empty or not, and please, if you feel more comfortable with a seat between you and another household do say so to the person planning to sit next to you without any embarrassment. Consider this too, when sitting in front of, or behind, someone on the rows.
- We will keep the building **ventilated** as much as possible, with windows open.
- We can **chat** in the building after a service, but if the weather is fine, we encourage you to chat outside.
- We continue to encourage people to **exit** via the back door into the outside space for the time being.
- We plan to continue administering wine at **The Lord's Supper** this month in a safe manner.

#### PLANNED CHANGES FOR NEXT SUNDAY – 17 OCTOBER

- Due to increasing numbers, the **extra row of seats will be added back** into the main worship area. (Next Sunday is also a Thanksgiving service for Jessie & Nathan Hyde, so we are expecting extra visitors!)
- We will be serving refreshments from the front after church one of the changes to this is that we are asking everyone to bring their own 'keep cup' (travel mugs / mugs with lids) to use. We have a small number available for those who do not have (and cannot get) one, but if would help us massively if you can please bring your own to church from next Sunday onwards.

- Road closure Walshes Road! South East Water plan to install 200m of new water main in Walshes Road, from July 26. The project is expected to take c.12 weeks to complete. Walshes Road will be closed for the

duration in three sections: First, between Stone Cross Road and Walshes Road to the junction at Kingfisher Drive. Secondly, between Kingfisher Drive and Nightingales. Finally, between Nightingales and Luxford Road.
