SUNDAYS AT ST RICHARD'S

If you are a regular member of the church family, you will know that our plan is to continue coming out of lockdown and social distancing gradually. We long to open up and do as much as we can together, but the overriding principle is a love and concern for others, especially those who feel less confident and more vulnerable than we might. So that said, a brief reminder of some of the things we are doing, and encouraging all of us to do together, over the coming weeks:

- We are now serving **refreshments** from the front after church we are asking **everyone to bring their own 'keep cup' (travel mugs / mugs with lids) to use.** We have a small number available for those who do not have (and cannot get) one, but if would help us massively if you can please bring your own to church.
- We will still have hand sanitiser at the doors for you to use coming in and going out.
- Masks have once again been made mandatory (10 Dec 2021) so please do wear a face covering unless you are exempt or under the age of 11 yrs.
- As a courtesy please ask the person you plan to sit next to if they want you to leave a seat empty or not, and please, if you feel more comfortable with a seat between you and another household do say so to the person planning to sit next to you without any embarrassment. Please consider this too, when sitting in front of, or behind, someone on the rows.
- We will keep the building **ventilated** as much as reasonably possible, with windows open.
- We can **chat** in the building after a service, but if the weather is fine, **we encourage you to chat outside**.
- We continue to encourage people to exit via the back door into the outside space for the time being.
- We plan to continue administering wine at **The Lord's Supper** this month in a safe manner.

Please wrap up warmly as we do need to open windows for good ventilation.

East Sussex County Council – Essential gas pipe work - will start on 10 January for approximately nine weeks in three phases.

Phase one - Alice Bright Lane, Brooklands Avenue and Stone Cross Road.

Our engineers will be working in Alice Bright Lane and Brooklands Avenue on 10 Jan for approximately four weeks, to access our network safely we will need to close Alice Bright Lane at the junction with Stone Cross Road and the junction with Hurtis Hill Access will be maintained for residents and a diversion will be in place via High Broom Road & Hurtis Hill.

Phase two - Stone Cross Road and Burnt Oak Road

On the 17 January for approximately two weeks, we will move into Stone Cross Road and Burnt Oak Road. We will need to close Stone Cross Road from the junction with Alderbrook Close to the junction with Alice Bright Lane. Burnt Oak Road will be closed at the junction with Stone Cross Road to outside Pick Pale. Access will be maintained for residents and a diversion via High Broom Road, Hurtis Hill, Stone Cross Road & Fermor Road and Fordbrook Hill, Hadlow Down Road, Walshes Road and Femor Road will be signposted.

Phase three - Aldervale Cottages

From 7 February for approximately five weeks, we will be working in Aldervale Cottages, we will need to close the road and the junction at Stone Cross Road for the duration of the time we are there. Access will be maintained and a diversion will be in place via Fordbrook Hill, Hadlow Down Road, Walshes Road, Fermor Road & Alice Bright Lane.
