FIRE SAFETY

As part of our Health & safety awareness we must ask you to read and familiarise yourself with the Fire safety procedure at St Richard's.

General procedure:

- If the fire alarm sounds we will all make our way out of the building quickly and calmly as directed by leaders and sidesmen.
- The meeting point is out of the front of church and take a left walking down to the parade of shops keeping to the pavement. This means you are well away from the building and road as there are usually parked cars out the front.
- Parents are to leave the worship area when asked to and are not to go and look for their child. Sunday school leaders will bring the children out safely and unite them with parents at the meeting point.
- Abled bodied people are to leave first and less able people to be assisted by carer appointed helpers. Please do not try and exit before quicker folk as this can cause a bottleneck and put more people in danger.
- Please take a moment to look at the fire Evacuation procedure and emergency plan found on walls around the building. (and attached to this email)
- In any case... All bags and personal belongings should be placed under your chair during the service to avoid trips during an evacuation.

Fire & Evacuation Procedures

St Richard's Fire Safety -Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) 2021

Any person discovering a fire should:

- SOUND THE FIRE ALARM
- DIAL 999 TO CALL THE FIRE BRIGADE
- ADVISE LOCATION ST RICHARD'S CHURCH, FERMOR ROAD, CROWBOROUGH, TN63AP
- ATTACK THE FIRE (IF POSSIBLE) USING THE APPROPRIATE FIRE FIGHTING APPLIANCES PROVIDED <u>BUT DO</u> <u>NOT PUT YOURSELF IN DANGER!</u>

On hearing the fire alarm:

- LEAVE THE BUILDING BY THE NEAREST EXIT ROUTE
- DO NOT DELAY TO COLLECT PERSONAL ITEMS
- CLOSE ALL DOORS BEHIND YOU
- REPORT TO APPROPRIATE ASSEMBLY POINT
- DO NOT RE ENTER THE BUILDING UNTIL ADVISED BY THE FIRE AUTHORITIES THAT IT IS SAFE TO DO SO

Fire Assembly Point: PARADE OF SHOPS OPPOSITE NIGHTINGALES ESTATE

- The church building has three exits:
- Main entrance
- Via the rear store room through the hall area
- Side door to the back of the main worship area
- Once at assembly point Fire Safety Officer or other responsible person should carry out a head count

All exits, stairways and corridors used as part of an escape route must be kept clear of all obstructions.

Self-closing/fire doors must operate properly and MUST NOT be wedged open.
