For our Prayers

Going for Growth

The primary phases in our Going for Growth project are:

- Phase 1 the purchase of the Hawes bungalow.
- Phase 2 the purchase of the St Richards site.
- Phase 3 the design and construction of new facilities.
- Phase 4 setting the foundation that springboards our church into the next season of its ministry.

So, we pray...

Thank God for the completion of Phase 1, the speed in which the funds were raised and therefore affirming that we should go ahead with phase 2.

Pray for phase 2: Following last weeks' meeting between SMAA, AS, SR CWGT and the DBF secretary. Give thanks that the path is clear and now mapped out for our site to be sold by its current owners SMAA & AS, and subsequently purchased by CWGT. Pray for the effective fulfilment of the next four next steps in that path.

- 1) Legal confirmation that upon the sale of our site all possible covenantal restrictions are revoked. (they will be yet written confirmation of this by a registrar has been requested).
- 2) A suitable mutually agreeable surveyor can be found to fulfil the "section 119" valuation process
- 3) The drawing up of a mutually agreeable lease agreement between CWGT and the congregation of SR
- 4) That this lease agreement will be acceptable to the Disease to grant us a license to worship on our site

With phase 3 being "paused" to allow All Saints to catch up with St Richards in terms of securing a site for their future developments (project "next generation"). Please continue to pray that we would be impassioned for mission focussing on growing the people of God's Kingdom (existing and new) and not our property and projects. Pray for our steering group as they consider the options to make the best use of the property (both sites) and as they seek a meeting with the CWG Trust that our proposed use of a strip of land between the hall and the bungalow will be met with favour, and the necessary permissions – planning etc. – may proceed in earnest.
