For our Prayers

Going for Growth

The primary phases in our Going for Growth project are:

Phase 1 the purchase of the Hawes bungalow.

Phase 2 the purchase of the St Richards site.

Phase 3 the design and construction of new facilities.

Phase 4 setting the foundation that springboards our church into the next season of its ministry.

So, we pray...

The prayer for phase 2 will remain the same for now. Give thanks that the path is clear and now mapped out for our site to be sold by its current owners SMAA & AS, and subsequently purchased by CWGT.

Pray for the effective fulfilment of the next four next steps in that path.

- 1) That SMAA will have their queries satisfied
 - UPDATE SMAA have confirmed they are willing together with AS to submit a request to the Diocesan Board of Finance to sell their stake in our site, subject to the sellers valuation.
 Give thanks to God that this significant milestone has been reached.
- 2) A suitable mutually agreeable surveyor can be found to fulfil the "section 119" valuation process
- 3) The compilation of the paperwork that constitutes the formal request to the DBF
- 3) The drawing up of a mutually agreeable lease agreement between CWGT and PCC of All Saints and St Richards
- 4) That this lease agreement will be acceptable to the Disease to grant us a license to worship on our site

With phase 3 being "paused" to allow for further investigation into the plausibility of All Saints securing a site for their future developments (project "next generation"). Please continue to pray that we would be impassioned for mission focussing on growing the people of God's Kingdom, that it will not be that long before we're hiring in the baptism pool again!

You may remember from the last Take2 Sunday where a proposal to utilise a strip of land of the Hawes to create a third space and office for Mark were shown. Give thanks for Karl and Andrew Steen who have worked on the production of the necessary plans to be presented to the Trust and the planners. Pray that our request to move the telegraph pole will be responded to asap. Pray that the steering team may be able to meet with the trustees asap.
