Financial Update from our SRMT

St Richard's management Team would like to thank you so much for your generosity as a congregation.

Through God's grace, we as a church have given so generously over the years. Between 2017 and 2023 our giving has increased by £32,000. This is an increase of 320%. However, as you know, you all know, the cost of living has risen substantially. So gas, electricity and wages have all increased significantly. As a result of these increases, we are looking at a deficit budget of £7,000 for this year, with a further deficit expected to come in 2025.

With this in mind we are asking you as a congregation to prayerfully consider whether you might be able to increase your regular giving. It is, according to scripture, a healthy thing to give financially to support the life and growth of church ministry. But, giving should be done willingly and based on what each believer is convinced they can afford and are happy to provide.

"Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." (2 Cor 9:7)

If you do not currently give financially to St Richards, and would like to know how, then please speak to Fay Smith after a Sunday service, or contact the church office on 01892 611318.

Going for Growth and Side Expansion (temporary) Projects

Project "Going for Growth" is the name given to the joint project between St Richards and All Saints churches to provide robust building facilities to meet the growing needs of our church community and the community of Southern Crowborough. The project started in 2021 with the purchase of the Hawes bungalow (next door) by the Crowborough Weald Gospel Trust (CWGT). There have been many twists and turns along the way, yet we give thanks to God that we have seen every hurdle overcome.

The latest stage in the process is getting the land titles for the bungalow and our current site under single ownership. As part of this process All Saints and St Michaels and All Angels PCC's need to sell their stakes in the land and buildings we occupy to the CWGT. To achieve this a suitably qualified and agreeable surveyor is required to comply with Section 119 Charity Commission rules which cover the sale of Charitable assets. **Give thanks** that such a surveyor has been approached, and subject to their initial checks and acceptance of the invitation to create the valuation this important stage will go ahead.

Project "Side Expansion (temporary)" is the name given to the joint project between St Richards and the Crowborough Weald Gospel Trust to utilise a section of land between the side hall and the bungalow to provide temporary additional space while the Going for Growth project progresses. This will enable us to create a third teaching space essential for our Sunday youth work, office accommodation for our minister, massively increase our "kerb appeal", increase parking, increase the flexibility in how our site is used by the community, and with two staff on site the increased security allowing for an 'open building'. Pray for the meeting with the Crowborough Weald Gospel Trust on Monday to discuss the proposals
