Helping teenage girls to make wise, biblical choices that set their heart on the right course.

#### Jim George


Helping tweenage boys to make wise, biblical choices.



# Opportunities to Grow in our Faith

### **Bible overview course**

What can really help our bible study is a framework that covers the whole bible. One way of creating that is through being part of an interactive course group.

This term in our Home Groups we will be running through <u>The Bible Course</u> created by the Bible Society it is an eight-session course helping us explore the BIG story.



If you would like to join a group speak to Trish or Mark. If you are already in a group pick up your book from your home group leader.

"Big, complex, old ... just some of the words people use to describe the Bible". Sound familiar? That's where *The Bible Course* comes in. The course will increase your confidence, equip you to read the Bible better and help you to see its relevance to daily life. The course provides a birds-eye view of the world's bestselling book.

Over eight interactive sessions, it combines video teaching, group discussion and personal reflection and daily readings.

### **Bible reading NOTES**

A great help and starting point for getting into the bible is using 'bible notes'. More than just a verse for the day, these lead us through chunks of the Bible at a time, giving us a sense of the bigger storylines and themes of the Bible and its books. Check out... ### The bible and Archaeology

This term at our Sunday morning gatherings our sermon series is on the book Exodus. We know we do not need archaeology to prove whether the biblical accounts of historical events are reliable, but it is certainly fascinating when cities, regions, dynasties, and specific rulers literally come out of the ground 3500 years later. Exodus is a book that has many significant global events described as it dovetails with the Egyptian nation. Amongst the many people who write and vlog on this, one that Mark finds particularly helpful is Joel Kramer. For example, there has been much debate on which Pharoh was the Pharoh of the exodus, well, Joel has a great <u>video</u> on that.
