Bibles

<u>English Standard Version</u> (ESV) – the one we use in church – more literal great for study.

<u>New International Version</u> (NIV) – a best all-rounder for study and reading

<u>New Living Translation</u> (NLT) – great for reading using everyday English

All are available as a 'study bible' with companion notes. e.g. <u>ESV study Bible, W Grudem, Crossway</u> All are available online to read and listen to as an 'Audio Bible' for free via <u>BibleGateway</u> All are available as apps for your smartphone either version specific or multi-version eg. <u>YouVersion</u>

For a suite of study tools, including meaning of words and commentaries on the text online check out the <u>BibleHub</u> website.

Bible reading NOTES

A great help and starting point for getting into the bible is using 'bible notes'. More than just a verse for the day, these lead us through chunks of the Bible at a time, giving us a sense of the bigger storylines and themes of the Bible and its books. Check out...

Bible reading PLANS – 365 days

Whereas 'bible notes' tend to be a monthly programme, 'reading plans' are usually a 12-month program of passages to read – which may be a book each month or even for the more adventurous the whole bible in a year. These also usually include guided study notes and thoughts helping us to look deeper.

<u>The Robert Murray M'Cheyne</u> reading plan is the reading plan that spawned all reading plans, with a section from the Old Testament, New Testament and Psalms each day. It will take you through the Old and New testaments once and the Psalms twice.



Loving Your Church by Reflecting Christ to One Another By Barnabas Piper


How to build genuine, real, deep, honest and authentic Christian relationships as a community of believers.
