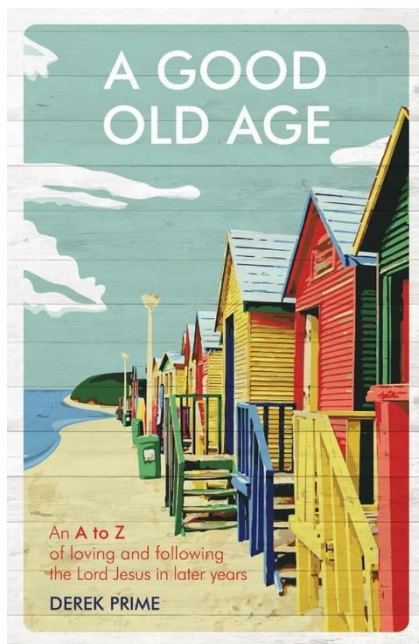
A Good Old Age
